According to the International Dyslexia Association (IDA), "Phonological Awareness (PA) is the ability to identify, think about, and manipulate the sounds in spoken language. It's a key early literacy skill that helps children learn to read and spell."



Phonological awareness includes two types of skills:

- Phonological sensitivity (This skill involves larger units of language, such as words, syllables, onsets, and rimes.)
- · Phonemic awareness (This skill involves the smallest units of sound in spoken speech, called "phonemes.")

Phonological awareness develops before formal schooling and continues through third grade and beyond. Some activities that can help teach phonological awareness include: Rhyming, Counting words in a spoken sentence, and Clapping syllables in spoken words."

The course is designed for classroom teachers, school administrators, Special Education teachers, literacy coaches, tutors, speech & language therapists, ELL teachers, and even parents. This course has been provided to many schools and school districts around the country. This is for students in grades Pre-K – 5.
